Preliminary ISAT Results, 2011

Audubon's ISAT Composite score increased from 90.0% to 93.5% from 2010 to 2011.

Reading scores increased by 5.8 % to 91% meeting or exceeding state standards. This is our fourth straight year of improvements in Reading. In 2007 our scores were 68.5%

Math scores increased by 1.8% to 95.7% points. In 2007 our scores were 79.7%. The fifth grade class reached 100% meeting or exceeding in Math.

Science scores increased by 2% to 94.3%. Science scores were 74.4% in 2007. The 7th graders improved by 30.8 % over their own 4th grades scores.

Reading exceeds scores increased by 8.7% to reach 36.5% students exceeding standards. In 2007 this number was 10.1%.

In math, students exceeding increased by 9.7% to reach 47.1% exceeding. This number was 19.8% in 2007.

The percent of students exceeding standards in Science nearly doubled, up 23.8 points to 49.4%. This was only 10.4% in 2007. This is a 33.4% cohort increase of students exceeding since 4th grade.

There are currently only two students in the school who scored at the Warning performance level in Reading. No students scored in that lowest performance category in Math.

Significant progress was made closing the achievement gap between typical students and students with IEPs in Reading (from 43.5% to 61.3%). The achievement gap between students receiving free lunch and those that do not also shrunk in Reading and Mathematics.

Keeping pace with Audubon: In 2007, our composite score was 74.4%. In 2007, 91 schools in CPS had a composite between 70 and 78. Five years later, only 4 of those schools have a composite over 90%; only one has a composite higher than Audubon, and no school scoring over 90% has shown more growth than Audubon
